Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Declaration Policy

1. Purpose of Policy

a. This policy sets out the evidence and procedures required for an individual to establish that they are of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent. Our definition of an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person is based on the definition commonly known as the Commonwealth Definition.

2. Scope of Policy

a. This policy will be used by the School when assessing the eligibility of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander applicants into our programs.

3. Establishing Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander status

- A person may confirm Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander identity through:
 i. A letter on an official letter head stamped with the common seal and signed by the chairperson or appropriate delegate of an incorporated Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander organisation. The letter must confirm;
 - * That they are of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent, and
 - * That they identify as an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, and
 - * That they are accepted as such by the community in which they live or previously lived
- b. The individual applicant is responsible for providing evidence of their own Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander identity.

4. Confirmation and Approval Process

- a. Once an applicant has provided their documented evidence it will be viewed by a panel consisting of at least one Aboriginal staff member.
- b. If the documentation is deemed insufficient the Admissions office will: i. Contact the applicant and seek additional evidence
- c. If the applicant is unable to provide the required evidence by the due date they will not be eligible for this pathway or an identified scholarship. The decision of the panel is final.
